

Total SA helps pupils to progress in sports

Total South Africa in association with the school's talent advancement initiative Get Ahead Sports Programme (GASP), hosted a three-day sport event at the Arthur Ashe Complex last week.

About 180 pupils took part at the event and showed exceptional talent and potential for development in sports and engaged with expert coaching teams who assisted in the improvement of the pupil's sporting and sport-leadership skills.

The coaching team consisted of exercise experts from Virgin Active,

Cricket South Africa and Tennis South Africa.

The programme afforded opportunities to athletically talented pupils located in various parts of Soweto to advance in sports.

This initiative was a natural extension of Total's programme which was launched in South African schools in 2010.
